The Houseboat, dating back to the 1950's, was originally moored at the Township's North Dock facing East Lacey Road and the Municipal Parking Lot (currently the Captain's Inn location), and was owned and operated by Henry (Dater) and Mable (Mae) Horner. The Houseboat was open April thru December, serving breakfast and lunch at the prices of the time: hamburgers 25¢, cheeseburgers 30¢, hotdogs 15¢, and Henry's delicious homemade clam chowder 25¢ a bowl. Fishermen, coming back after a long day at sea, gathered at the Houseboat for chatter and Dater's famous clam chowder, and often stayed late into the night just talking about their day.



ANONYMOUS CRIME TIPS

The Lacey Township Police Department website (www.LaceyPD.org) helps connect the police department with the community. One of the most successful aspects of the website is the ability for residents to submit truly anonymous crime tips to the police department through the "Crime Tips" button on the main menu of the home page (www.LaceyPD.org/crime-tips/). This feature allows for anonymity, as no sender information is relayed through the system. The police department has received hundreds of anonymous crime tips since the implementation of the website in January of 2013. The tips have proven to be extremely valuable and have contributed to the police department quickly solving criminal cases as well as identifying and effectively dealing with some nuisance concerns in neighborhoods.

The website offers many other valuable services as well. The police department posts a weekly police blotter along with other postings regarding matters of public concern. The website is also used as the platform to post to the police department Facebook page and Twitter account. Members of the department understand that an informed public is in a much better position to assist the police department in effectively dealing with matters that concern the community.

UNDERAGE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Lacey Township has taken the significant step of enacting a Township Ordinance to prohibit the consumption of alcoholic beverages on private property by persons under age 21. This ordinance is

important, as existing state law only prohibits underage possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in a public place. Township Ordinance §130-14 now holds an underage person accountable regardless of whether the alcoholic beverage was possessed or consumed in a public place (e.g., the woods) or a private place (e.g., house party). This new law is unique, as a juvenile charged with the ordinance is required to appear in a municipal court rather than juvenile court. It is important to note that it has always been unlawful to provide or make available alcoholic beverages (or property to consume alcoholic beverages) to a person under the legal age of 21 (N.J.S.A 2C:33-17).

LOCKING HOMES & VEHICLES

The Lacey Township Police Department is requesting that residents lock their homes and vehicles as a matter of common practice. Consistently, the thefts that occur from motor vehicles are limited to those vehicles left unlocked and easily accessible. Likewise, unlawful entries of homes most often occur in residences left unlocked. The practice of locking your home and vehicle(s) can save you from the disconcerting experience of being a victim of burglary and theft.

MOTORIZED SCOOTERS /GO-PEDS /MOPEDS

The Lacey Township Police Department would like to remind residents that motorized scooters, whether electric or gas powered, are not only dangerous, they are **ILLEGAL** to operate on roadways or sidewalks.

Although the scooters are legal to sell and purchase for operation on private property (with the permission of

the property owner), at no time are the scooters legal to operate on public thoroughfares.

Violations related to the use of motorized scooters are strictly enforced by the Lacey Township Police Department with the scooters being impounded until the time of court as specified in Lacey Township Ordinance 238-5B.

RESTRICTION ON PARKING TRAILERS

Lacey Township has an ordinance which strictly prohibits the parking of trailers (when not attached to a vehicle) on the roadways within the township. This same ordinance prohibits vehicles with a gross vehicle weight of over 15,000 pounds from being parked on roadways within the township as specified in Lacey Township Ordinance 323-17.





SOLID WASTE COLLECTION at Curbside

SOLID WASTE RULES & REGULATIONS:

- Place solid waste containers at curbside either the night before collection or by 6:00 am the day of collection
- Remove your containers within 24 hours after collection
- All household garbage, especially food waste, must be in leak-proof 32 gallon containers with lids and serviceable handles, and together with its contents must not exceed 50 lbs. when full.
- Garbage set out in Corrugated Cardboard will not be collected. Corrugated Cardboard is a mandatory Recyclable item.
- Electronics and Televisions are mandated Recyclables, please bring them into the Recycling Center
- Refer to the pick-up schedule above for your collection days.

Got Drugs?

The Lacey Township Police Department is a permanent drop-off location for proper disposal of unwanted and unused prescription medications. Please bring medications into the Lobby of the Police Department at 808 West Lacey Road, Forked River, NJ 08731, call the Police Dept. at 693-6636 if you have any questions.

Syringe Disposal – A Free, Safe Disposal Program – Southern Ocean Medical Center Manahawkin & Community Medical Center, Toms River, are participants in this Program endorsed by the New Jersey Dept. of Environmental Protection; Southern Ocean Medical Center Family Resource Center, 609-978-3559; Community Medical Center, 732-557-8005 (Housekeeping)

The Solid Waste Contractor is Meadowbrook Industries, 609-971-7979, please contact Meadowbrook directly to report a missed pickup or to schedule an appliance or metal pickup.

SOLID WASTE SERVICE INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:

- **Household garbage, food waste, ashes, non-recyclable plastic or paper, grass clippings.**
 - Hedge clippings, small brush, tree branches are recyclable and can be brought into the Recycling Center. If you cannot bring them in please tie and bundle no more than 4' in length weighing no more than 50 lbs. per bundle or place in your container for trash collection.
- **Furniture and Bedding**
 - Residents only, does not apply to businesses, 2 furniture pieces per collection day; mattresses/box springs. Do not set out any sofas, chairs or mattresses if there is a chance of rain unless you cover it in plastic.
- **Carpet**
 - Approximately 1 room/collection day. Carpet must be tied and bundled no more than 4' in length weighing no more than 50 lbs per bundle, cover in plastic if it is raining.
- **Lumber**
 - Scrap lumber pieces can be tied and bundled no more than 4' in length weighing no more than 50 lbs per bundle, or place in garbage container for collection.
- **Wallboard/Plaster Board**
 - Only 3 cans or bundles per month, weighing no more than 50 lbs. per can or bundle.
- **Sliding Glass Doors**
 - Tape up the glass and wrap the entire door in a heavy duty tarp or blanket, label the door as glass. Call the Public Works Department if you have questions prior to setting these doors out for garbage collection.
- **Televisions (if you are purchasing a new TV, your retailer is required to properly dispose of your old one.)**
- **Appliances and Metal items**
You must call the Public Works Department at (609) 693-1100 x2301 or Meadowbrook Industries at (609) 971-7979 to schedule a pickup.

The following items **WILL NOT BE COLLECTED** at all, it is up to Residents to properly dispose of these items, call the Public Works Department for information prior to setting them out at curbside.

- House clean-outs
- Building and construction materials, fixtures, windows, etc, resulting from major alterations and renovations to properties by owners or contractor's, especially those that required a Building or Demolition Permit
- Concrete, brick, asbestos
- Tires and auto batteries
- Paint, motor oil or antifreeze
- Propane tanks
- Trees, earth, root matter and stones
- Concrete and asphalt
- Household Hazardous Waste including pool chemicals and fertilizers
- Mandated Recyclables – please refer to Curbside Recycling Collection and/or Recycling Center information

HELPFUL HINTS:

- Are you moving into or out of town? Call Public Works at (609) 693-1100 x2301 with questions relating to the disposal of out-of-the-ordinary items. Don't assume that everything you throw out will be collected. Call us first!
- If you are emptying the contents of a house, you must get a dumpster. There are several reputable haulers, call around to get the best price. Expect to pay for the rental of the dumpster and the disposal fee at the landfill. Trash just piled at the curb will surely generate a visit from our Code Enforcement Officer.
- Solid Waste along with Asbestos, Construction Debris and Wood can be disposed of at the Ocean County Landfill. There is a charge for disposal, please call 732-323-8528 for information. Asbestos must be packaged properly and can only be disposed of at the Landfill, you must call for instructions and packaging material.



RECYCLING COLLECTION at Curbside

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS:

- Place Recycling containers at curbside either the night before collection or by 6:00 am the day of collection
- Remove your containers within 24 hours after collection
- All Recyclables must be in 32 gallon containers with lids and serviceable handles, and together with its contents must not exceed 50 lbs. when full.
- Rinse all containers, remove lids from cans and caps from bottles and jars and discard them in your regular trash.
- **Do Not put any recyclables in plastic bags.**
- **Do Not tie or bundle any paper**
- Refer to the Recycling Zone Map for your collection day.

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLABLES CONSIST ONLY OF THE FOLLOWING MATERIALS:

- Mixed paper, Newsprint, Corrugated Cardboard, Glass Bottles and Jars, Plastic Bottles, Aluminum Cans, Aerosol Cans (all bottles, jars, cans and aerosol cans must be empty).

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

We DO NOT accept hazardous waste. This includes toxic household products such as herbicides, pesticides, household cleaners, paint thinners, pool chemicals, solvents, gasoline, thermostats, thermometers and photographic chemicals. Save these products for disposal only on Household Hazardous Waste Collection Days sponsored by Ocean County. Dates will be published in advance by the County. Not sure if a product is hazardous? Call Ocean County at (732) 506-5047 for information.

LEAF COLLECTION at Curbside

LEAF COLLECTION RULES & REGULATIONS:

Leaves must be set out in biodegradable paper bags, plastic bags, or 32-gallon containers for collection

- All leaves must be placed at curbside by 7:00 am on the start of each collection cycle
- There is no limit to the number of bags or containers that may be placed at curbside for pickup
- Do not mix any debris in with your leaves. Leaf bags or containers containing debris or garbage will NOT be picked up. YES, we will look into the bags you set out.
- Do not rake leaves into a pile at curbside and do not rake them into the street. Violation notices will be issued by Code Enforcement.
- Keep leaf bags/containers away from your trash so as not to confuse the two.

Curbside Leaf Collection is a service provided by the Township as a courtesy to its residents and can only be accomplished by adhering to the start dates as indicated. Since it is impossible for us to determine the volume of leaves that will be set out for collection, we cannot offer a specific date as to when your leaves will be picked up. It is our intent to collect leaves that are placed at curbside on the start of each collection cycle within a 2 week period.

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions:

- **Pine needles are considered the leaf of the Pine tree and therefore should be included with leaf pickup.**
- **Twigs, acorns, and pinecones are considered vegetative debris and should be put out for trash pickup.**
- **The leaf collection program will NOT be extended**

SPRING LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE:

1st Cycle begins Monday, April 4.

2nd and Final Cycle begins Monday, April 18.

FALL LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULE:

1st Cycle begins Monday, November 14.

2nd Cycle begins Monday, November 28.

3rd and Final Cycle begins Monday, December 12.



RECYCLING CENTER

The Lacey Township Recycling Center is located on Municipal Lane. Residents may bring their recyclables to this location throughout the year.

Recycling Center hours: Monday thru Friday – 7:00 am to 3:15 pm, Saturday and Sunday – 8:00 am to 3:45 pm.

The Recycling Center is closed on every holiday that the Municipal Offices are closed. Call the Public Works Department at (609) 693-1100 x2301 or visit the Township website at www.laceytownship.org for updated information and weather-related closings.



SECURITY CAMERAS ARE IN USE AT ALL TIMES. IT IS A VIOLATION OF THE LAW:

-for any person to drop off or leave recyclable materials at the Recycling Center at any time other than normal hours of operation

-for any person to leave material, except designated recyclable materials, at the Recycling Center at any time

-to remove any materials from any containers at the Recycling Center

VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.

THE RECYCLING CENTER ACCEPTS THE FOLLOWING:

● Electronics and Computer Equipment

- Residents only
- E-Waste: Computers, monitors, TV's, and laptops ONLY
- It is your responsibility to destroy the hard drive and have data wiped from equipment prior to recycling

● Paint

- Residents only, NO Contractors
- Latex, oil based, and boat paints only. No varnishes, polyurethane or wood preservatives.
- Full, partially full, or empty 1- and 5-gallon paint cans
- EMPTY aerosol spray paint cans may be disposed of with Single Stream Recycling. Full or partially full aerosol spray paint cans are considered household hazardous waste; Call Ocean County Household Hazardous Waste at (732) 506-5047 for disposal information.

● Used Clothing

- Deposit in the bins provided

● Car & Boat Batteries and Automobile Tires

- Residents only, NO Businesses
- Up to 4 passenger car tires per person (Residents only) with rims removed. NO TRUCK TIRES.

● Motor Oil & Antifreeze

- From Residents personal vehicles only
- Must be in a disposable 1-gallon container; leave with the attendant on duty
- Maximum of 5 (five) 1-gallon containers per person

● Shrink Wrap (Residents and Businesses)

● Single Stream Recycling (Residents and Businesses)

Glass & Plastic Bottles, Jars and Cans

- Aerosol cans (including EMPTY spray paint cans), aluminum and other metal cans that food & beverages come in
- All bottles where the neck is smaller than the body of the container
- NO plastic bags, buckets, 5 gallon pails, tubs, or similar items

Mixed Paper, Magazines, and Corrugated Cardboard

- Catalogs, envelopes (including cellophane windows), junk mail, office paper, non-metallic wrapping paper, NCR paper, newspaper (DO NOT BUNDLE), telephone books, hard cover and text books (remove hard covers and throw them away), boxes, cartons, and similar material. DOES NOT INCLUDE wax-coated or poly-coated boxes or soiled pizza boxes.

● Brush

- From Residents only. Landscapers & Contractors are prohibited from dumping Brush at the Recycling Center at any time.

● Leaves

- If leaves are in a BIODEGRADABLE PAPER BAG, the entire bag can be left in the designated

leaf pile. If leaves are in a PLASTIC BAG, you MUST EMPTY THE BAG into the designated leaf pile. DO NOT leave plastic bags in the leaf pile.

- Landscapers may dump leaves at the Recycling Center but MUST come into the Public Works Office to sign in during the week and must see the Recycling Center attendant on weekends.
- Brush and Leaves brought to the Recycling Center are processed into mulch that is free to Lacey residents when available.

MATERIALS THAT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED:

- Building and construction materials, fixtures, appliances, etc.
- Propane tanks
- Fluorescent bulbs
- Trees, earth, root matter, and stones
- Concrete and asphalt
- Hazardous Waste (including pool chemicals) or bio-hazardous waste such as soiled diapers.
- Plastic bags or anything in plastic bags
- Anything tied or bundled with string
- Paper milk or juice cartons
- Ceramics, flower pots, window or automobile glass
- Large plastic tubs or buckets
- Scrap metal
- Plastic caps or lids
- Cereal boxes or soiled pizza boxes
- Liquids
- Styrofoam

The Recycling Centers will accept 4-foot, 6-foot, and 8-foot fluorescent tubes, smaller circular tubes, and newer compact fluorescent bulbs.

Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.



Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.
- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.
- Recycle used motor oil.
- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.
- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.
- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:
 - Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.
 - Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
 - Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.



Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.
- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.
- Participate in community cleanups.

Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.
- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

To Our Business Community


Over the past few years we know that many of you have received Recycling Compliance inspection visits from the Ocean County Health Department. The Department is composed of many Divisions but the representatives that we see most often are the inspectors from the Environmental Division. They have the enforcement authority to routinely conduct Recycling inspections throughout the County, can answer your questions, and help bring your company into recycling compliance with not only local ordinances but also those mandated by the NJDEP. Most often they refer you to us to see if we can help and most often we can. The Township does offer a Limited Curbside Recycling and Solid Waste Collection Service Program to businesses and institutions operating in our town. The guidelines can be discussed with you individually. To ask questions or to ascertain eligibility to participate in our program, please contact the Public Works Department at 693-1100 x 2301.

Some facts that you should know.....

- Business and institutions in Lacey Township are **NOT EXEMPT** from Recycling. You must recycle the designated materials and are subject to the same rules and regulations as our residents.
- It is mandatory to separate designated recyclable materials from solid waste per the New Jersey Statewide Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act.
- Businesses and institutions must report on an annual basis to the Municipal Recycling Coordinator a Tonnage Report indicating the amount, type, and disposition of materials, along with the vendor that is providing these services for you.
- If there is a trash can, you need a Recycling Can next to it. Recycling Labels are available at the Public Works Office.

Businesses and institutions in Lacey Township are NOT EXEMPT from Recycling. If you need help setting up a program, please contact Public Works at (609) 693-1100 x2301. RECYCLING IS NOT AN OPTION, IT'S THE LAW.

To report a streetlight outage:

- Call the automated outage reporting line at 1-888-LIGHTSS (1-888-544-4877). For faster service, use the phone number associated with your account and say "streetlight problem" after the greeting.
- Visit www.firstenergycorp.com, and select your electric company. Under Outages, click on "Report Streetlight Problems."

When you contact us, just let us know the following:

- Your name and phone number, in case we need more information
- Address where the streetlight is located – nearest house or business address and the nearest cross street
- The number on the pole
- What is wrong with the streetlight – for example, damaged pole, light fixture is broken, the light is on during the day, or the light flickers



LACEY TOWNSHIP RECYCLING ZONE MAP
